III. About the poem –

Theme: In the present poem, the poet expresses the touching memories of childhood and feels happy that he still carries it in his heart. These memories are the breathing spaces in his dull and monotonous routine life.

The poet recalls the village where he has spent his childhood. He becomes nostalgic. The sad tone is mixed with innocent and joyful childhood memories. He remembers an old

peepul tree. It guards childhood memories against the termites of time. He recalls many things from his village. These are sunburnt boy in bright daylight, at night ghosts dance under the tree, a broken well which is canopied by the branches of the tree and at present only ghosts of memories in his mind. It means only memories breathing.

He remembers his affectionate mother, stern father, green fields, red brick-walled house. The red color of the red wall symbolizes optimism and the father's angry face.

He could not be rooted like a peepul tree. So, he shifted to another place because of duties and responsibilities. But he has carried a little garden in his heart. The white roses and garden are symbolic. The white rose means the purity in the innocence of every child. The garden is evergreen and unforgettable memory of childhood. When a poet awakes at midnight, his childhood appears before his inner eye. It is like just a slideshow of a bygone period. It gives relief in his present hard and routine life.

The poem applies to all those who are born and brought up in villages, but left for cities because of - like further education, career and various ambitions and dreams of life to be fulfilled. But everyone cherishes his/her childhood memories. Here, the memories transport him into a trance state. It gives happiness. So, his childhood memories are breathing spaces in his busy routine life.
